Continuing Professional Development (CPD) Requirements	Designees must accumulate a minimum of 60 CPD points over a three (3) year period.
Application of Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)	Candidates are required to submit a Portfolio of Evidence to assess prior knowledge and skills against the competence framework of a travel professional. The Designation committee assesses the evidence submitted.

- Have an extensive practical experience to finalise complex transactions.
- Understand regulations, rules, procedures within the booking process.
- Deal with complexities related to travel operations, technology and reservations.
